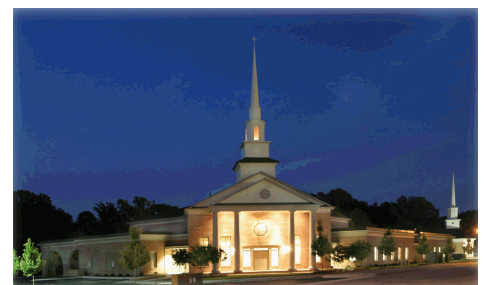

Why is there a need for the Rotary Leadership Institute? – Rotary needs a constant influx of leadership since club officers and other leaders change every year. It is difficult, at the club level, to learn enough about the exciting world of Rotary with its 1.2 million members in more than 160 countries. Furthermore, leadership skills in a voluntary organization are often different from business leadership skills. Effective clubs realize that their success or failure depends in large part on the quality of their leaders, and they recognize that club leaders must have every opportunity for education. Rotary Leadership Institute offers an outstanding opportunity for each club to improve the Rotary knowledge of its key people, while being exposed to new ideas of leadership. The exchange of ideas with other experienced Rotarians alone makes the courses worthwhile. This newsletter describes the opportunities in the coming months. RLI recommends that clubs nominate and send those Rotarians who appear to have the potential for club leadership, not necessarily as future presidents.



RLI – Columbia, SC – The Columbia campus of The University of Phoenix will be the venue for a RLI scheduled for Friday, August 24, 2007. Sessions will begin at 8:30AM and end at approximately 4:00PM.
